



Veneer Grades:

- A Light: Unjointed light face veneers for natural color components
- A2: Unjointed face veneers without color restrictions for staining purpose
- A(1/1): Unjointed light face veneer for natural top of chairshells
- A(1/3): Unjointed light back + underside of chairshells- half sheet A, half sheet BC
- A(2/2): Unjointed face grade without color requirements, for stained or coated faces of chairshells
- A(2/3): Unjointed back + underside grade without color requirements, for stained or coated chairshells, one-half sheet A2, one-half sheet BC
- B Light: Light core veneers primarily used for narrow visible arm rests without color defects, 100 % closed surface – partly jointed from A-grade randoms
- B: Unjointed closed veneers with point defects and without color requirements for coating with Sliced Veneers or HPL
- BC: Core veneers with small holes and small cracks
- BCD: Core veneers for shells of chairs with 15 - 20 mm Ø holes and cracks up to 5 mm width
- CD1: Veneers for upholstery purpose without loose knots-particles which would contaminate the glue
- CD2: Veneers for upholstery purpose with dead knots to lay on glued veneers at the press

Other species available are European White Oak, German Poplar and European Ash.
